
PHASE 1 OF OUR NEW SCHOOL PROJECT AT OFFINSO BEGINS IN JANUARY 1, 2016.

On December 27, 2015, two members of our Board of Directors will visit Ghana to begin phase 1 foundation and infrastructural project works at our new school project site. A generous grant we received in September 2015 from Liddell Foundation of Dallas Texas is funding phase 1 of the project. This Liddell Foundation grant will enable us to lay a solid foundation for our new school for orphans and poor children in the Offinso District of Ghana. Our special thanks go to Jacob and Kourtney Hartsock of Norman, Oklahoma who initiated this

grant for our new school. From our current cost estimates, we believe that this seed money will empower us to accomplish the following preliminary tasks at the new school site:

- Building a permanent concrete security fencing around the school
- Installing two entrance gates for the school
- Drilling and installing two deep well water projects at the new school site, and
- Shipping 58 large boxes of donated books, laptops and desktop computers, clothing and shoes for the needy students in our educational assistance program.

Our visiting ACEF team will stay in Ghana for 3 months [December 28, 2015 to March 31, 2016] to complete the above phase one projects. Please join us in praying for travel mercies, good health and God's protection and guidance for our children and workers in the field. The combined prayers of faithful people go a long way towards success. Above is a picture of the 5-acre new school site showing the school boundary geodetic survey demarcation process, which took place in June 2015. A contract has been signed for the placement of 2 water wells and water storage towers.

In the Summer and Fall of 2016, we will begin phase 2 projects which include the construction of administrative offices, classrooms, kitchens, toilets and playgrounds. We trust that because we have a will to build this lasting gift as a legacy to the least of these our brothers and sisters, there will be a way to complete this school.
