SUPPORTED US IN 2017: We are confident that our partners share in our vision and will continue to empower us to accomplish our Christian missionary goals of taking care of the educational and survival needs of our orphans and needy children in Ghana.

GHANA YOUTH LEADERSHIP ACADEMY PROGRESS REPORT:

With the initial grant of \$26,600 donated by the Liddell Foundation in September 2015, we were able to complete Phase 1 of the Academy construction which included: a 6-feet concrete security wall around the 5 acre school property, 2 security entrance gates, 2 deep water bore holes and 2 water towers supplying constant clean water for drinking and construction purposes. In 2017 the Liddell Foundation provided a second grant of \$23,700 which enabled us to complete the school's foundation and landscaping works shown in the pictures below.

In Calendar Year 2018 we are hoping to raise the necessary funds (\$200,000) for the construction of 2 Kindergarten and 6 Primary classrooms, Toilet facilities for Staff, Boys and Girls, Kitchen, Dining Hall and the provision of a School Bus and teaching staff offices. We encourage all our institutional and individual supporters to consider making contributions towards this critical phase in the development of the school. Our plan is to begin to admit our first set of Kindergarten and Primary school students in September 2019. SALUTING OUR 2017 STUDENT GRADUATES:

In 2017, our Educational Assistance Program produced the following 3 graduate students who are moving on to higher levels of education or compulsory national service programs, a precursor to getting hired into permanent government employment positions. Our three 2017 graduates are the following:



Vida Konadu Agyemang: graduated from Kwame Nkrumah University Of Science and Technology in Kumasi, Ghana. Vida's major is Oncology.



Isaac Opoku Agyemang: graduated from Nursing Training College at Pantang with specialization in Mental Nursing.



Anthony Akuoko: graduated from Antoa Senior High School. He has qualified for admission to Colleges in Ghana in 2018.

SPONSORED STUDENTS IN BOARDING & DAY SCHOOLS:

In 2017 we sponsored 33 orphans in various schools and colleges, with 16 of them attending Boarding Schools where housing, meals and libraries are guaranteed. For financial reasons, the other 17 non-sponsored students attend Day Schools and live at home with grandparents, who are unable to pay for boarding school privileges.




Hannah Asamoah: a sponsored orphan student who began attending Ntonso Adventist Girls Senior High School in Sept. 2017.

Our special thanks go to the H2OKIDS at H2OCHURCH.CC MISSIONS of Ada, Oklahoma, who planned and participated in a special "PIE SALE FOR MARY" project and raised \$332 to assist Mary to reopen her hair salon business which she had closed down from September to December of 2017 in order to deliver and nurse her first baby. Mary is an orphan who was sponsored for 3 years by H2OCHURCH.CC MISSIONS of Ada, Oklahoma, to study hair styling business. After her graduation 2 years ago, A.C.E.F. granted her the initial capital to open her own hair salon. The photos below were taken when Mrs. Anna Osei-Kwame and our A.C.E.F. Coordinator in Ghana delivered the H2OKIDS donation of \$332 to Mary in a surprise visit. Occasionally, we do follow-up visits to our vocational student graduates who have opened up their new businesses to make sure their new businesses are thriving successfully. We are happy to report that Mary re-opened her hair salon business on Tuesday January 2, 2018 with the help of the \$332 capitalization gift from H2OKIDS. Mary has sent a special thank you letter and video to the H2OKIDS, the Pastors and Congregation members who supported the H2OKIDS in this charitable giving.





According to Missions Outreach Pastor Tyson Brown of H2OCHURCH.CC MISSIONS in Ada, Oklahoma, his church "wants to be known as a church with a heart to serve. That belief is taught to their kids at every age level. That's why the church quickly got behind their 5th and 6th graders when they decided to have a Pie Sale for Mary Adowaa from Ghana, Africa."

Mary is a young lady who H2OCHURCH.CC MISSIONS had already been supporting on a monthly basis as she attended Hairstyling School through ACEF's Women's Sustainability Program. The H2OKids heard her story from their Missions Pastor Tyson Brown and wanted to do something to get her additional help.

Pastor Brown shares the following: "With the support of **Ally Chapmond**, H2OKIDS Director, they quickly raised \$332 in a matter of hours selling donated pies on a Sunday morning during church. Then they sent their money to their friends Peter and Anna Osei-Kwame at A.C.E.F. to be hand delivered to Mary. The kids were unaware of all the challenges Mary was encountering at this time in her life." This is clear evidence that God will empower others to do for us what we are incapable of doing for ourselves, after we have done all we can do.
